Each Sunday in Advent a different family lit the candles and led our call to worship. They included members of the Lord, Newman, Burnside and Lestinsky/ Humphrey families.











Board of Trustees

Overall, the financial plan is proceeding as expected. The year-to-date income is 5% ahead of the year-to-date planned amount. A more detailed look at some of the major revenue lines shows that planned giving is 2.75% below the year-to-date expected amount and all planned transfers from the trust funds for the year have already been taken, thus creating the positive difference between the year-to-date income and the year-to-date planned amount.

When reviewing expenses the year-to-date expenses through the end of November are tracking lower (3.3% below) than the year-to-date financial plan and are also below the year-to-date income thus providing an end of November net income of \$26,048.37.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

Our Ministry To Members

We have been working on putting together a long range plan for our church and ministry. Pastor Cal shared the committee's work so far at the Quarterly Meeting in October. Although the full plan is being worked on, we have begun fleshing it out and making it real. For example, our Board of Trustees is installing a new lift to provide handicap access to Fellowship Hall. They hope to have it completed by6 the end of the year. Special thanks to Scott Hallamore for being the conduit in getting the new lift. He had the connections. Bob Burnside, Jim Collins, Randy Sargent and Ray Deptulski are doing the heavy lifting to get it installed. Lucy Davis was responsible for putting together the grant application which will bring 75% of the cost of the money back to the church from the Baptist Home Board of Rhode Island Baptists.





On Saturday, December 14th the Friendship Circle and Board of Deacons provided the assistance needed to get Kay Perone home for a few hours. Kay is at the Royal Health in Westerly. Her home is being sold. This special visit was arranged by Meredith Eckel and a host of others. Special thanks to all the guys who provided assistance getting her in and out of the house. This is what church is all about. We are the family of God.

On Wednesday, December 18 as group of seventeen cheerful folks went out on the town in the wind and rain to see some of our elders. We went caroling and visited six of our friends. We had a blast as we brought the church to them.

You will also read of our new initiative to our Seniors called SALT (Senior Adults Living Triumphantly.) This ministry will be especially for those members and their friends who are 55 years and older.

Persecuted Church

The Democratic Republic of Congo - DRC - is the second largest country in Africa and with a population of around 109 million, the DRCongo is the most populous French speaking country in the world. Originally colonized by King Leopold II of Belgium in 1885 it was given independence in 1960. Through 2003 it experienced a series of civil wars killing in excess of 5 million people. It is now a stable democracy.



The Congo was a destination for missionaries starting in 1881 with George Grenfell, who was a Baptist missionary explorer in the mould of David Livingstone. He established a series of outposts mostly along the Congo river. Others of note are CT Studd, a great missionary pioneer who went to DRC in 1913 and established Heart of Africa Missions (now WEC International) and WTF Burton who arrived in 1915 and established Congo Evangelistic Mission. These ministries started literally thousands of churches throughout the country, which along with the significant work done by Roman Catholic missions under the sponsorship of the Belgian government has resulted in 95% of the population identifying as Christian.


These facts would lead us to believe that persecution is not experienced in the DRC but the following story shows the current reality. Tchabi is a town in northwest Congo, built on a hill with a hospital, school, church and runway built in the 70's by missionaries. This area was the part of the country where CT Studd established his mission posts in the 19th century. Unfortunately the northwest has become a center of rebel activity fueled by unrest in Rwanda and Uganda and Islamic influence from Sudan. In 2019 militants from the ADF, a violent Islamic group attacked the town, abducting 40 residents including hospital staff. Most were subsequently released but some are permanently missing. Later that year they returned and tried to burn down the town, damaging or destroying much of it including the church. The militants told one surviving Doctor "we want you gone because Christians are our enemies". After this many fled but in 2021 a final attack forced even those remaining to flee. Altogether 182 were killed in the attacks and a number of people abducted, not to be seen again.

Finally in 2023 the Congolese government and UN deployed soldiers to the area and some survivors have now returned to their town. Voice of Martyrs ministry has been providing spiritual support including trauma counseling to those who have returned. One resident said that the teaching on forgiveness had greatly helped his spiritual healing. The attacks had killed his wife and six grandchildren.

In this part of DRC dozens of armed groups aligned with ISIS and other extremist Islamic groups target Christians as they seek to establish Islamic law there. The church there needs to be actively supported and strengthened as they endure this intense persecution. We can do our part through prayer, keeping ourselves informed about the plight of our Christian family and helping the ministries that work in this area.

MINISTRIES TO BE STRENGTHENED IN 2025

I'm excited to share about two ministries that will be strengthened this year.







Second, I'm excited to announce that last summer, I applied for a new ministry initiative grant offered by The Baptist Fund to enhance our children's ministries at Central Baptist. I shared my vision for a sports camp with Pastor Cal, which was approved. At the beginning of November, we received the great news that we had been awarded the \$2,500 grant. This sports ministry will offer a yearly, one-week soccer camp focusing on physical skills, attitude, and spiritual growth.

As we start the new year, please keep all our Christian education and discipleship ministries in your prayers. A healthy church is one that makes disciples. The Bible says, "Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ. For this I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me" (Colossians 1:28-29, ESV).






