We need volunteers to join us in leading Kid's Church. As our program grows, we are seeking team leaders and weekly helpers. It's a great opportunity for all ages to serve.


PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

It was December of 1969 that I first stepped into the little church on the green in Lebanon, Connecticut. My aunt Connie invited my dad to bring my little brother and I to the church Christmas party. No one could have guessed how that simple invitation would change my life forever. I felt welcomed there. Before long I came to know the love of Jesus and gave my life to him.

That's what can happen when you invite someone to join you for worship. This is the best time of year to do that. Everyone is more open to hearing the Good News associated with the birth of Christ. What makes Christmas special is not the holiday movies or the tinsel trappings of the shopping season or the joyful laughter of Santa. It is the Good News of Great Joy that Jesus Christ was born! Through his birth God entered human history and took on the role of Savior. More than anything else, it tells us that God loves us. People need to hear that. They need to know that in Christ we can find forgiveness and new life. Too many people are walking around carrying heavy burdens and feeling that no one cares. You can let them know that God cares. The Board of Trustees team is making final adjustments to the 2025 spending plan as the fiscal year comes to a close. Fritz Eckel and Michelle Hallamore are researching the implications of the Westerly water system lead concerns resulted from recent changes

in state standards and its impact on the Church and Parsonage water systems.

The replacement of the individual lift enabling people with limited mobility access to Fellowship Hall will be delivered in late November. We are planning to have it installed by the year end.

The invitation to join the Board of Trustees or attending the meetings to present your ideas or concerns is always open. We meet the third Monday of the month at 4:30 in Fellowship Hall.

Overall, the financial picture is positive. Year-to-date planned giving is lagging by approximately 2% (\$4,000) however, year-to-date expenses are currently lower than planned amounts by 4% (\$21,000) resulting in a year-to-date net revenue of \$17,644. Overall, the financial plan is tracking to finish close to the planned amounts.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allow the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!

3 Another option is to visit <u>www.cbcwesterlyri.org</u>, then click on the Donations link at the top, or scan this code on your phone to access CBC's online giving app. If your phone's camera can't scan the code, the URL for the app is: <u>https://app.easytithe.com/app/Giving/cbcw</u>.

You can give either directly from your bank account or ... (for a higher fee) use a debit/credit card.

The app uses the same security as bank websites, so your personal information is secure.

Also, it allows you to schedule your donations in advance, so 'once and it's done'!






Stewardship Moment



Fiction


A Christmas Bride in Pinecraft - by Shelley Shepard Gray



SMILES AND SO FORTH



Have you ever wondered about **THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS**? What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a Catholic reality, which the children could remember.

The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ. Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments. Three French hens stood for faith, hope, and love. The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The five golden rings recalled the Torah or law, the five books of the Old Testament. The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation. Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy. The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes. Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control. The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments. The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples. The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.
