PASTOR CAL'S CORNER

Dear Friends.

David Letterman was famous for his "top ten" lists. I want to follow his lead today. We had a terrific Back to Church Sunday celebration last month but it was never intended to be a "one and done" event. We want to see everyone every week when we gather for Worship & Kid's Church. So here is a little something I borrowed from a sister church. Here are the top 10 reasons for coming back to church.

10. Church is Where We Find Deeper Meaning In Our Lives

In our most frustrated and stressed out moments it's easy to lose sight of the greater plan and purpose that's out there for all of us. Gathering with others in church and seeing young and old all seeking God together helps us hold on and keep running our race.

9. Church Fills Our Hearts with Song

There's something remarkable about music. Listening to hymns and inspirational music can lift us up and give us messages we may not otherwise hear. It's amazing how open our hearts can become through song. Many a time I have witnessed the weight of the world lifted off shoulders and uncalled for tears flow the moment that first song begins playing. Through music, we feel strengthened. Instruments playing and people singing are a conduit to God.

8. Church Teaches Us To Let Go Of Disappointments

Life has many disappointments, frustrations and annoyances. Maybe a friend has let us down, our kids have been out of control lately, or our spouse has said or done something hurtful. Forgiveness is hard, and yet, when are finally able to let things go, it can take a huge weight off our shoulders. There's no better place to be reminded of the gift of forgiveness that we have already received than by going to church and hearing the Word. Our hearts cannot help but be softened in the process.

7. Church Helps Us Find Perspective in our Trials

Someone I was talking to recently was struggling because, try as he might, he couldn't get to stable ground at work. He was juggling a heavy workload and family concerns and didn't feel he was doing justice to either. The daily fog never seemed to clear. He remarked to me after attending a church service "I can't even tell you how many times I've been struggling and found that the message applied so directly to my situation that it felt like you were talking directly to me." There is a good reason for that. Jesus spoke about the need to get away from the crush. Regular attendance forces us for an hour or so, to step back, gain perspective and recharge our inner batteries!

6. Church Provides Opportunities to Give Back

Most evangelical churches offer assistance to their communities and other areas of need around the world in a variety of ways. Here at Central we have several ministries you can get involved with where you can give back to others with the love of Christ. What a joy infusing exercise it is to "Serve the Lord with gladness..." (Psa. 100:2).

5. Church Allows Us to Feel Reverence

Our every day lives can get pretty chaotic can't they? There is a universal hunger for some peace and quiet...even reverence. The Psalmist must have had these same feelings when he expressed, "Be still, and know that I am God..." (Psalm 46:10). When we attend worship in person (unlike online) we're transported to a place of worship and peace. I'm always amazed at the peaceful feeling that washes over me the moment I walk into our building. It's a place of calm and a place of joy. Attending church gives us a weekly reset. It calls for us to stop and pray and to express humility and gratitude to God. It allows us a welcome respite from the hustle and bustle of our daily lives.

4. Church Helps Us Better Partner with our Family

Not everyone is on the same page as his or her spouse or children when it comes to faith. However, reports show that couples that attend church together have higher levels of happiness and satisfaction within their marriage. Families that pray together stay together. Why is that? Church reconnects us to a common point. It reinforces the higher purpose behind marriage and family, more than just dwelling in the same house. Families who attend church together are reiterating the important foundations of the home.

3. Church Connects Us Socially

The New Testament gives Christians a lot of "one another" instructions: things that we should and enjoy as a family in Christ. The term is used 100 times in 94 verses. Peter reminded us of our privilege and obligation to socialize as bothers and sisters in 1 Peter 5:14. Church attendance connects us socially. People need people. The old TV western The Lone Ranger was one of my favorites growing up. But even he had Tonto! If you're struggling to meet people or to make friends, this is the place to do it!

2. Church Gives Us a Chance to Reflect Gratefully

By stopping our regular day-to-day life and practicing gratitude, we begin to realize just how blessed we are and how much we truly have. Even when things seem dire we can rejoice with others at church and thank God for our blessings. Worship helps us stop and look around and realize the things we have. It encourages thankfulness as a way through the tough times, Even if it's hard to see the blessings at the moment, attending church can help us open our hearts and eyes to see the things we have.

1. Church Uniquely Unites Us with God

When we enter a house of worship, we're instantly elevated to a state where we're honoring God and opening ourselves to Him. Maybe that is why the Psalmist encouraged us, "Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; worship the LORD in the splendor of his holiness." (Psa. 29:2). The simple act of walking in the door brings us closer to God. We're making time for God by allowing Him into our daily routines by attending an actual place of worship. There is just something reverent about simply being inside a church building that is unequaled anywhere else. It helps us remember that there is something out there bigger than ourselves.

Overall, the financial picture is very positive with year-to-date revenue ahead of the year-to-date expenses. At the end of August year-to-date revenue was less then (0.5% below) the planned amount. This change from what was reported last month (revenue greater than planned amount) is reflected in the August income numbers being much less than the August planned amount. It is not uncommon for August collections to be lower than planned for in the budget, this should resolve as we move into September.

Expenses through the end of August are tracking lower (7% below) than the year-to-date financial plan.

As always, the generous donations and faithful support of Central Baptist members and friends allows the church to actively serve our community while also proactively maintaining our church properties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much!



Board of Deacons



(NLT) says that "Grandchildren are the crowning glory of the aged" and Psalm127:3 (NLT) states that "Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a reward from him." So being a grandparent is meant to be a blessing. With this blessing, however comes responsibilities. Proverbs 13-22 declares that "Good people leave an inheritance to their grandchildren ..." While this verse appears to apply to material wealth, it can also be interpreted to mean leaving a heritage of faith. God, in Exodus 10:2 (ESV) commands the Israelites to share "in the hearing of your son and your grandson ... what signs I have done ... that you may know that I am the LORD." Grandparents have a responsibility to share with their grandchildren their knowledge of God and to testify to what He has done in their own lives.

In the New Testament (2 Timothy 1:5), we see the Apostle Paul crediting Timothy's grandmother for playing a vital role in Timothy's faith. He says, "I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure dwells in you as well." Timothy's grandmother cultivated a faith first in her own daughter, but then continued by cultivating that faith in her grandson as well. Another example of affection is shown in the story of Naomi and her daughter-in-law Ruth. Naomi's son (Ruth's husband) died and Ruth married another relative and gave birth to a son. "Then Naomi took the child in her arms and cared for him." (Ruth 4-16) Even though this baby was not genetically her grandson, Naomi adopted him as such and became his caregiver.

Grandparenting can come in many forms and should not be limited to those who are related biologically. In this day and age of broken and blended families, there are numerous opportunities for older Christians to develop affectionate, caring relationships with children who need them.

One thing we can all do for our grandchildren and every other child that we know is to pray for them. Let me leave you with this sample prayer:

Almighty God, as (Child's Name) wakes up to a new day, I pray for their happiness and well-being. May they find joy in simple moments, strength in challenges and peace in their heart. Guide them with your hand and let them feel the warmth of your love throughout their day. Bless them with an ever growing faith in your grace and wisdom. Amen

Dear Friends,

Everybody needs a Norm in their life. Do you remember the lovable lush in the television sitcom, "Cheers?" Whenever he entered the bar, where everybody knew your name, the crowd would shout, "Norm!" It was one of the signature moments in the show.

What made him memorable was the fact that he was the kind of person who brightened your day. He would always have a quip or a one liner that made everyone smile. He always helped others see things from a different perspective when they brought their problems to him.

The truth is that you don't actually have to be named Norman to be this person. One of my "Norms" is actually named Walter. I met him several years ago. He was the custodian at church at the time. It seemed like he'd always stop by my office when I was having a tough day.

It was like he sensed that I needed a word of encouragement or a shoulder to lean on. He'd come in and before long, I was able to see things in a new light. He wasn't a theologian. He didn't come in with deep philosophical thoughts. He was simply there for me.

Years have gone by but it seems whenever I need a lift, I will open my email or I will get a text. Up pops a message from Walter. He only sends them every so often but they always come at the right time and make me smile.

Have you ever thought about the fact that you may be somebody's "Norm or Walter?" God uses people like us to reach out and bless others. We may not even realize that He is doing it. It simply comes as a still small voice nudging us to act.

The apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 12 that we are the body of Christ. When God wants to bless someone, he uses people like you and me. He finds someone with a willing heart, hands and feet and sends them out. They come to us like an angel when we need to be uplifted or loved.

Anyone can be a Norm. No special skills or training are required. All you need to do is ask God to use you. Then listen for His voice. He will send you out to meet someone's need. In your actions, you just might be an answer to someone's prayer and a reminder that God knows their name, too.




